Shelley Launey has been the Director of the National Clean Cities Program at the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) since 1999. In this capacity, she directs the program efforts of both headquarters and regional DOE staff and oversees the activities of over 80 local coalitions. The Clean Cities program is a nationwide effort to accelerate the deployment of alternative fuel vehicles in public and private fleets.

Prior to Clean Cities, Ms. Launey initiated several small business and university programs at DOE, which enabled these sectors to contribute to the development of the transportation technologies necessary to manufacture an 80 mpg mid-size vehicle. As the Manager of University and Small Business programs, she established R&D programs, a graduate education program, and a vehicle competition program for university undergraduates.

Ms. Launey was also Chief of Staff for the Assistant Secretary of Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy from 1989 to 1993. At the time, this office was responsible for over 500 people and approximately \$1 billion. The Office was engaged in research, development and demonstration of energy efficiency and renewable energy technologies in the building, industry, transportation, and utility sectors. Ms. Launey managed the immediate office operations and provided oversight for all Office responsibilities.

Ms. Launey has had a long history managing energy efficiency programs in several sectors at DOE. She also taught high school in Bozeman, Montana.
