Published twice monthly, *AIDS Treatment News* reports on experimental and standard treatments, especially those available now. The staff interviews physicians, scientists, other health professionals, and persons with AIDS or HIV; they also collect information from meetings and conferences, medical journals, and computer databases. They report on long-term survivors who have usually tried many different treatments and found combinations that work for them. *AIDS Treatment News* does not recommend particular therapies, but seeks to increase the options available. *AIDS Treatment News* is supported by tax-deductible contributions and subscriptions to the print edition; the Internet edition is free.

Each issue of *BETA* includes "News Briefs," "Research Notes," "Women and HIV/AIDS," a listing of open clinical trials, and an extensive glossary of terms. Also available in Spanish.

There is no mention on the Web site to indicate how often the publication is updated, but on the home page is a "This Week's News" section that seems to be current. The goals of *HIVandHepatitis.com* are to improve quality of life, slow disease progression, and increase survival time among the hundreds of millions of people living with HIV, hepatitis B, or hepatitis C. A medical doctor reviews all items submitted for publication. Link buttons at the top of the page connect to "HIV Treatments," "Hepatitis B," "Hepatitis C," "About Us," and a search engine for the site. You can sign up on the Web site to receive weekly e-mail updates of top treatment news stories, feature articles, questions and answers, and announcements of interest.
