Requirements: Preference will be given to applicants with a bachelor's degree in medical technology (ASCP) with some experience in flow cytometry and familiarity with CLIA regulations and quality control.

The appointment is for up one year and may be renewed upon recommendation of CDC and subject to availability of funds. The participant will receive an annual stipend depending on background and experience. The participant must show proof of health and medical insurance. Participants do not become employees of CDC or the program administrator and there are no fringe benefits paid.
