*AIDS* is the official journal of the International AIDS Society, the nonprofit organization that sponsors the biennial International AIDS Conference. It is a technical publication written for clinicians and researchers. The full text of articles is available in PDF format.

Published twice monthly, *AIDS Treatment News* reports on experimental and standard treatments, especially those available now. The staff interview physicians, scientists, other health professionals, and persons with AIDS or HIV; they also collect information from meetings and conferences, medical journals, and computer databases. They report on long-term survivors who have usually tried many different treatments and found combinations that work for them. *AIDS Treatment News* does not recommend particular therapies, but seeks to increase the options available. *AIDS Treatment News* is supported by tax-deductible contributions and subscriptions to the print edition; the Internet edition is free.

A medical doctor reviews all items submitted for publication. Link buttons at the top of the page connect to "HIV Treatments," "Hepatitis B," "Hepatitis C," "About Us," and a search engine for the site.
