Why Prizes

- Increase cost-effectiveness to maximize the return on taxpayer dollars;
- Increase the number of solvers tackling a problem and to identify novel approaches, without bearing high levels of risk;
- Bring out-of-discipline perspectives to bear;
- Pay only for success and establish an ambitious goal without having to predict which team or approach is most likely to succeed; and
- Establish clear success metrics and validation protocols in the prize rules that themselves become defining tools and standards for the subject industry or field.

Accelerator for U.S. Domestic Energy and Global Business Opportunities

The American-Made Challenges incentivize the nation's entrepreneurs to reassert American leadership in the energy marketplace. These new challenges seek to lower the barriers U.S.-based innovators face in reaching manufacturing scale by accelerating the cycles of learning from years to weeks, while helping to create partnerships that connect entrepreneurs to the private sector and the network of DOE's National Laboratories across the nation.




Water Power Prize Portfolio: Supporting Hydro & Marine
