Describing the far-right

- Nationalistic
- Anti-global
- Suspicious of centralized federal authority
- Reverent of individual liberty
- Conspiracy theories
- Paramilitary training and survivalism
- Mainstream conservative movements and the mainstream Christian right are not included

The far-right poses a significant threat

- Domestic outnumber international terrorist attacks in the U.S.
 7:1 (LaFree, Dugan, Fogg & Scott 2006)
- The far-right claimed over 250 lives between 1978 & 2000 (Hewitt, 2003; see also Carlson 1995; Riley 1995)
- Far-right present in more states than other extremists, including Islamic Jihadists (Freilich, Chermak & Simone 2009)
- Other case-specific examples

The criminal activities of the far-right are a neglected research topic

- Most terrorism research focuses on international terrorism and studies on the domestic far-right's crimes usually rely on anecdotal or case study data
- F.B.I. terrorism definition: "The unlawful use of force or violence against persons or property to intimidate or coerce a government, the civilian population, or any segment thereof, in furtherance of political or social objectives" committed by a group.
- The F.B.I.'s definition excludes important categories of crimes

Limitiations of F.B.I. definition

- FBI's terrorism definition excludes important categories of crimes:
 - Excludes NON-federal (i.e., state) prosecutions
 - Excludes ideologically motivated crimes committed by lone-wolf perpetrators
 - Excludes incidents where group did not claim responsibility
 - Excludes non-violent ideologically motivated crimes
 - Excludes non-ideological/routine crimes
 - State and local municipalities subscribe to a broader definition

U.S. extremist crime study (ECDB), 1990- 2008


- Examines all known crimes committed by known far-rightists, 1990- 2008
 - Illegal incident,
 - Committed by far-rightist
 - Committed in United States
 - Committed between 1990- 2008
 - Identified in an open source
 - Led to an official response (hearsay not enough)


ECDB, 1990- 2008: Identifying cases

- Stage 1: A multi-tiered data collection effort that identifies incidents from a variety of sources:
 - Existing Databases
 - Official Sources
 - Scholarly and Journalist Accounts
 - Watch-group Reports
 - Media Searches

ECDB, 1990- 2008: Searching cases

- Stage 2: Incidents treated as case studies & examined in 22 search engines:
 - General search engines
 - Newspaper databases
 - Other search sites
 - Two step search process: (6) primary & (16) secondary engines







ECDB, 1990- 2008: Coding cases

- Each case assigned to a specific coder
- 5 relational ACCESS files:
 - (1) Incident,
 - (2) Suspect,
 - (3) Victim,
 - (4) Group,
 - (5) Quality of open source information




ECDB, 1990- 2008: Incidents

- 274 homicide incidents
- 120 (44%) Ideologically motivated
- 13 suicide missions that killed 33 people
- 18 homicide incidents in detention facilities
- 93 attempted homicide incidents
- 32 solicitation or conspiracy to commit homicide incidents
- Focus on homicide events (N= 274)


Homicide Incidents Over Time




Homicide Incidents by State




Homicide Incidents by State



Primary Weapons in Homicide Incidents






ECDB, 1990- 2008: Suspects

- 462 of 628 (74%) suspects for homicide incidents were far-right.
- 113 of 165 (68%) suspects for attempted homicide incidents were far-right
- 22 far-right suspects killed by law enforcement
- 38 far-right suspects committed suicide
- We focus on far-right homicide suspects (N=462)


Race of Far-Right Homicide Suspects




Age of Far-Right Homicide Suspects



Age of Far-Right Homicide Suspects




Sex of Far-Right Homicide Suspects




ECDB, 1990- 2008: Victims

- 522 homicide victims, 354 excluding Oklahoma City
- 34 law enforcement personnel killed in line of duty, 1 Judge, & 3 security personnel
- 125 attempted homicide victims
- 51 potential solicitation/conspiracy victims
- We focus on homicide victims (N = 354)


Race of Homicide Victims



Age of Homicide Victims





Sex of Homicide Victims





Homicide Victims: Law Enforcement


- 34 killed in 30 incidents (11% of homicide incidents)
- 26% killed during a traffic stop
- 11% killed were correctional officers















Group Involvement for Suspects Involved in Incidents where Local Law Enforcement Killed

Conclusion

- Database will be valuable tool for law enforcement and scholars
 - Document the types & frequency of crimes, regional variations & assess threats
 - Compare the behavior of groups that employ terrorist methods with those that do not
 - Examine "preparatory" crimes committed by far-right extremists
 - Develop/refine domestic terrorism training curriculum for law enforcement and other criminal justice personnel-- unique threat of traffic stops

Next steps:

- Coding far-right financial crimes (START 2008- 11)
- MAROB collaboration (START 2008- 11; 2009- 14)
- Integration project with ATS, GTD, TOP (START 2009- 14)
- Expand to ELF/ALF & jihadi homicides, attempted homicides, bombings & financial crimes (START 2009- 14)
- Protecting law enforcement project (future proposal)
- Measurement issues (selectivity bias) (future proposal)
