Travel Allowance: One round trip to the Center of Excellence for participants who live more than fifty miles, one-way, from their assigned Center.

Follow-on Funding: Up to \$50,000 in Follow-on funding may be awarded to faculty to continue research and collaboration efforts with the DHS Center for the 2016-2017 academic year
