Mission: The Office of Policy is responsible for developing unified policy positions for the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and conducts strategic planning, special initiatives, and policy analysis to enhance DHS mission execution.

Cyber Snapshot: Office of Policy/Cyber, Infrastructure, and Resilience (CIR) Policy ensures coordination across DHS components in the areas of cyber, technology, infrastructure and resilience, and works with other U.S. government departments and agencies and international, state, local, territorial, and tribal governments, academia, and private sector stakeholders to achieve DHS cybersecurity and infrastructure goals. The CIR Policy office develops coordinated DHS positions on policy issues, shapes the Department's strategy approach to cyber, technology and infrastructure issues, and engages internationally and with key stakeholders on associated issues. The office leads and coordinates cyber policy for the Department, supports operational planning for cybersecurity and develops cross departmental cyber security policy and plans.

OPC is especially interested in students that have completed coursework or previous work assignments related to: threat analysis; risk assessment; incident response; network monitoring/network defense; basic knowledge and understanding of cybersecurity policies, plans, and standards; and cybersecurity research and technical writing.
