- Global Security


# Graduate International Relations Program

# Security Policy

- This interdisciplinary study examines national and international security issues ranging from nuclear proliferation to trafficking.
- Students gain insight into security policies through courses such as:
  - African Security Issues
  - U.S. National Security
  - Women and War
  - Middle East Security Issues



# International Development Studies


- Taught by individuals actively involved in the field, students learn about the sociopolitical, economic, and cultural realities of human welfare in the global arena.
- It emphasizes analyzing and understanding the root causes of poverty and underdevelopment as well as considering various strategies and efforts to promote just, sustainable development.
- Courses range from Ethical Issues in International Development to the Foundations of International Aid.



# International Conflict Resolution

In this focus area an emphasis is placed on understanding the root causes of political, cultural and economic conflict, as well as policies and programs designed to prevent and resolve violent conflict.

# International Criminal Justice and Crime Control

Graduates will be better prepared to work in state and federal law enforcement through completing an interdisciplinary curriculum that includes the Globalization of Crime, Intelligence Gathering and National Security, and International Law & Treaties.

# Inter-American Studies

- Students examine interstate relationships through courses such as:
  - Economic History of Latin America
  - NAFTA Law
  - U.S./Latin American Relations.
- The professors have served and worked throughout Latin America and offer a hands-on perspective in these courses.



# Undergraduate International Relations Program

- The International Relations Undergraduate Program is an interdisciplinary degree drawn from courses in Economics, International Business, Political Science and History. The degree provides a broad understanding of world affairs and competence for entry-level positions in the field. It is also suitable for entrance into law school or graduate school.
